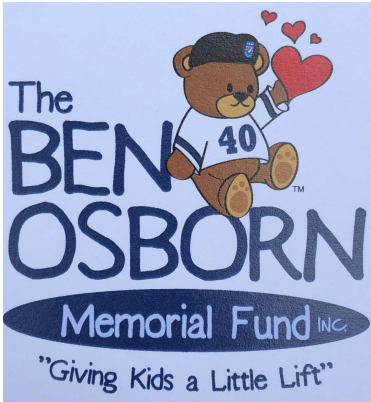




Our Newsletter for 2023

Dear Friends,

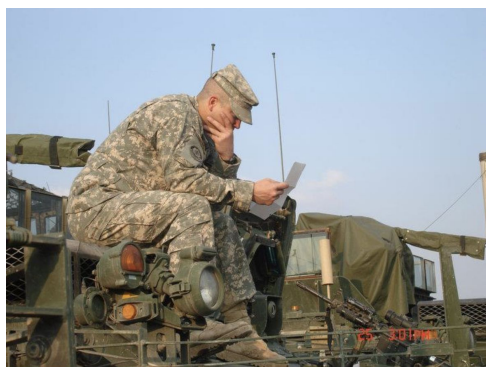
Since our last Newsletter, Ben's Fund has prospered with growth in our existing programs as well as expansion of our programs. Ben's hygiene kits, for example, have been welcomed by more schools, churches, and organizations than ever. We have done more with younger kids by offering an abbreviated version of our hygiene kits. We are providing hygiene products in bulk to schools such as Warrensburg and Greenwich. Instead of one and done, we are providing kits two, three, and even four times within the school year. Holy Cow! I think we are on the right track here.



Thanks, primarily to Dave Lebel and the Glens Falls Rotary Club, Ben's Book Stations have experienced tremendous growth. Not just in the number of our Book Stations, but also the amount of books processed as well. Annually we move in excess of sixteen thousand books for area youth to take advantage of.

We now offer twenty-six community based reading stations for kids to access all the time at any time. This past Fall we introduced Ben's Mobile Book Station. We now take our program on the road offering books to kids at such events as 4th of July in the park, Schoolapalozza, Military Appreciation Night at the Civic Center, a celebration of Christmas at the park in Hudson Falls, the Easter Egg Hunt at Derby Park and many more. Oh the smiles and the thanks from parents, that's what makes this undertaking so worthwhile.

Eagle Scout designate, Julian Campopiano, has chosen the Ben Osborn Memorial Fund as recipient of his community project to qualify him to earn Boy Scouts' highest rank: Eagle Scout. This is a significant achievement, one that will serve him well for the rest of his life. Julian's project is a new, larger, and much improved reading center at Hovey Pond, our busiest Book Station yet. What an outstanding job Julian and his fellow scouts did, under the supervision of Mr. Bill Moore, as CPL Ben would say, "Mission Accomplished". Congratulations and Thank-you for a job well done.



With this Newsletter we are formally introducing our ninth program or initiative—as always, to "give kids a little lift". This initiative is a little different in that we want to offer an emotional lift, covered with love, comfort, and "hope that life will be better for children who experience some of the worst life has to offer."

At its infancy, we have already distributed over a hundred and thirty cuddly Ben's Bears as we strive to bring some joy to bad situations. Please refer to page #5 for more information.

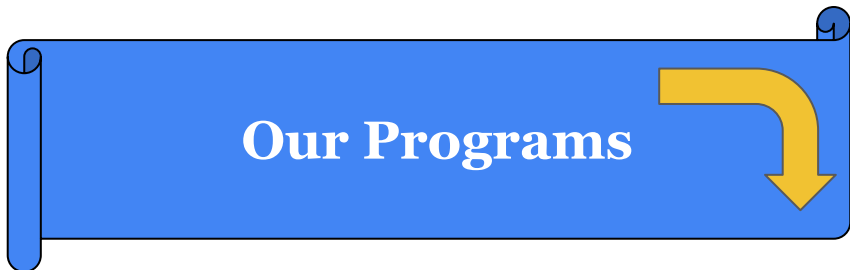

Welcome to our extended family - Steve Borgos, Dave Lebel and the Glens Falls Rotary Club. These outstanding volunteers have generously volunteered to oversee Ben's Book Stations. In doing so they have not only given of their time and talents, but provided a base of operations for our efforts. Because of the Rotary Club we now have a storage unit for our thousands of books and a dedicated group to oversee this program. Welcome and thank you for your help and support.



Our Programs

1. General Giving

Our first program was General Giving. This initiative was designed to “give kids a little lift” at a most basic level. One of our first requests was an \$8.00 sewing kit. At some point we evolved with donating a \$1000 cello for ongoing school use. Of course much of what we help with falls between these extremes. From school supplies to footwear, clothing, musical & sports equipment, funds to cover educational trip expenses and the list goes on. This is the core of who we are and what we provide. It will never change, except to grow.

2. Holiday Giving

For eleven years the Ben Osborn Memorial Fund has delivered “a little Christmas lift” to local children in need through our local partnerships. These children are identified by school personnel in the school districts we work closely with. We purchase and wrap each gift individually with the help of many giving elves.

3. Ben’s Book Stations

4. Local Food Pantries (See list on page 7)

Ten years ago, looking for a different way to reach children, we decided to take a back door approach. We reached out to local food pantries and asked what they needed that currently was not available to them that would benefit families with children. The feedback was they needed personal hygiene and household supplies. Now, almost exclusively, we provide both on a quarterly basis to 11 local food pantries.

5. Elementary School Initiative

Nine years ago it was brought to our attention that some of our elementary school children did not have snacks during the school day. Hunger can interfere with classroom concentration. Now we provide nutritious snacks to our partner schools who request them. We also supply a change of clothing to school nurses so that any child who has an accident or illness may return to class in comfort and with dignity. Additionally, blankets and head lice kits are provided as requested.

6. Hygiene Kits for Emerging Teens

In 2017 we unveiled our sixth initiative - Ben’s Personal Hygiene Kits! The contents of these popular kits were thoughtfully designed for the needs of emerging teens. The students will find in their bag 18 items helpful for healthy hygiene. This includes a toothbrush, toothpaste, shampoo, band aids, nail clippers, tweezers, cotton swabs, lip balm, hand lotion, mouthwash, soap, a wash cloth, a hand towel and a package of wet wipes. The carrying bag can be reused for other purposes, such as a book or clothing bag. **So far, well over 2,000 Hygiene Kits** have been donated to school health offices. Recently we have unveiled an abbreviated version of our popular hygiene kits, which are distributed to elementary schools.

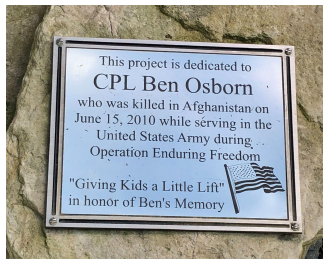

3. Ben's Book Stations

"Ben's Book Stations" are spread throughout Warren, Washington, Saratoga and Essex Counties and are created by Eagle Scouts and technology students in collaboration with local school districts. There are currently 26 Book Stations offering children and young adults the opportunity to read and be read to at home with promises for more in 2024. The Ben Osborn Memorial Fund set out to improve literacy in our community by offering books on an honor system. People may borrow a book and bring it back; or if it becomes a family favorite, they may keep the book and it will be replaced. All books are gently used or new and have been kindly donated with preschool to school-age students in mind.

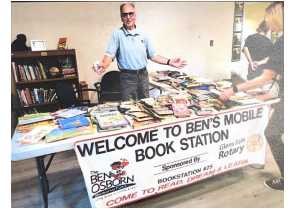

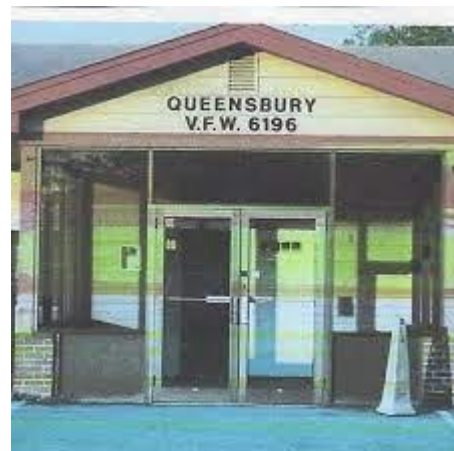

In its 13 years, Ben's Fund, a 501 C-3 charitable organization has helped thousands of children in **28 school districts (approximately 63 schools) in Warren, Washington, Saratoga and Essex Counties** throughout the school year and the summer months as well.

The number of children helped by **Ben's Fund** through its many channels of giving cannot be calculated - many thousands of books have been placed in Ben's Book Stations alone. The requests from our local school for clothing, eye glasses, emergency health needs, head lice treatment kits, healthy snack, as well as sports, musical needs, senior scholarships, personal hygiene kits for boys and girls and for emerging teens, prom attire, and school field trip expenses. We respond to holiday needs with the gift-giving of food and presents by adopting families through our **SANTA INITIATIVE**. These are some of the ways in which **Ben's Fund** has helped children in our communities. **Ben's Fund** is busy year-round working with area schools, donating to eleven food pantries, and helping twenty-five area organizations, all dedicated to the well-being of our area youth.

The above defines **WHAT** and the following answers **WHY**. We are all moved by Ben Osborn's goodness, his sacrifice, his loving and giving nature, and we are trying as best as we are able to continue his work out of respect for his memory and life by helping local children with need.

WHAT'S NEW? Our **Ben's Mobile Book Station** is our latest book station! On certain special days of the year, Mr. Osborn's white van magically transforms into a gleaming well-stocked Mobile Book Station filled with books & smiles for children attending local events including the annual Schoolapalooza at Crandall Park - where kids gather back-to-school-necessities free of charge. **Ben's Mobile Book Station** has also made appearances at the Civic Center for Military Appreciation Night; at Derby Park in Hudson Falls for the Grand Opening and the Easter Egg Hunt, and Cornell Cooperative Extension of Warren County's annual open house.

Do let us know if you come across a stash of children's books! We can always utilize children's books both old and new and we appreciate receiving them.

We now have 26 Book Stations available for children to find a book at any time. Our gratitude is extended to our partner, the Glens Fall Rotary Club and their volunteers who keep the Book Stations tidy & well supplied with books and in good repair, which is no small task!
